November Mission of the Month: UCC Hurricane 2024 Relief Appeal

The National Ministries of the United Church of Christ has a long history of supporting communities as they recover from disaster and their plight fades from the headlines. Your support of this appeal will ensure that communities are supported and accompanied for years as they rebuild.

On October 9th, 2024, Hurricane Milton landed on Florida's west coast, less than two weeks after Hurricane Helene devastated the region in Florida's Big Bend region, Georgia, western South Carolina, western North Carolina, and eastern Tennessee. Many people perished, roads were washed away, and several communities have been devastated by both tornados and flooding.

The Global HOPE team continues to be in communication with the Southeast, Southern, and Florida Conference staff, ecumenical partners in disaster recovery, and response coordination calls with the national network of voluntary organizations active in disasters (VOAD).

Several UCC churches throughout the affected

region have suffered extensive damage to their church buildings and surrounding communities. As the full impact of both storms continues to become realized, the Global HOPE team is helping to connect victims of the storm's devastation with immediate resources as well as preparing to support long-term recovery efforts.

Thank you for your assistance in helping families and communities who are in great need in the aftermath of these hurricanes. Your heartfelt support will make a difference.

Stewardship and Thankfulness for God's Gift of Creation

From a Christian perspective, the idea of stewardship is rooted in the belief that God entrusted humanity with the care of His creation. This responsibility is often drawn from Genesis 1:26-28, where humans are given the charge to "rule over" the earth, which implies a duty of care and management, not exploitation.

In the context of climate change, this stewardship could be interpreted as a call to protect and preserve the environment as <u>an act of obedience</u> <u>and love for God's creation</u>. The impact of climate change—such as the loss of biodiversity, natural disasters, and threats to food and water sources—affects the most vulnerable populations. This aligns with the broader Christian call to love one's neighbor and seek justice, particularly for the marginalized.

Engaging in efforts to mitigate climate change can be seen as a way to honor God's work, ensuring that the world remains sustainable and fruitful for future generations.

We must adapt to the extremes we can no longer avoid, but we must also transition quickly away from dirty, polluting energy sources. If we don't, the coming changes may be too great for us to adapt to.

Each of us can contribute to climate mitigation in our daily lives. We can all do our part by switching to an electric vehicle, installing roof-top solar, making our home more energy efficient, electrifying our appliances, and even considering changes to what we eat and how we commute. Even more powerfully, these actions can start conversations that make change contagious – with friends or family, or in our workplaces, schools, or communities.
